## Hislyn's Bookmark

I created this patter for my daughter, Aislyn as a special reward for reading me a book all on her own. She did it so I went looking for a pattern that fit her personality. I didn't see exactly what I was looking for so I decided to attempt my own. Aislyn is a little girl who loves her daisy chains and tiaras and I felt that I was able to show her personality in it. I hope that you enjoy this simple pattern!

I would also like to say thank you to my friend Muskaan for helping me write up my very first pattern and for testing it out and for encouraging me!

### Abbreviations:

ds – double stitch ch - chain

p – picot sep – separated

R – ring cl – close ring

Materials:

Size 30 & 40 DMC thread

2 shuttles

Wind shuttle using continuous thread method (CTM)

Begin by tatting 4 daisies using size 30 thread.

1<sup>st</sup> Daisy:



R. of 4 ds, 5p's sep. by 4 ds, 4 ds, cl.

Ch. of 5 ds, p, 5 ds, join to 1<sup>st</sup> p of R, 5 ds, p, 5 ds, join to next p of R. Continue on in this manner all the way around till you have 5 petals. Make last petal as before and join to the base of R. Tie and cut.

2<sup>nd</sup> Daisy: R. of 4 ds, 5 p's sep by 4 ds, 4 ds, cl.

Ch. of 5 ds, p, 5 ds, join to 1<sup>st</sup> p of R. 5 ds, attach to p of 1<sup>st</sup> daisy, 5 ds. Continue as before. Make a total of 4 daisies.



1<sup>st</sup> round: ( You may choose to wind two shuttles with size 40 thread, as this will make this round easier.)

Attach thread to p of daisy.

\*Ch. of 2 ds, 4 p's sep by 2 ds, 2 ds, join to p on next petal.

Ch. of 2 ds, 6 p's sep by 2 ds. Join to p of next petal.

Repeat from \* 2 more times.

Ch. of 2 ds, 4 p's sep by 2 ds, join to p of next petal


Ch. of 5 ds, p 5 ds, p, 2 ds.

#### Clover:

R. of 2 ds, join to last p of ch, 5 ds, p, 3 ds, p, 4 ds, cl.

R. of 4 ds, join to p of last R. 5 ds, p, 5 ds, p 4 ds, cl.

R. of 4 ds, join to last p of previous R, 3 ds, p, 5 ds, p, 2 ds, cl.



Ch. of 2 ds, join to p of previous R, 5 ds, p, 5 ds, skip petal and join to next p of next petal. Tie and cut. \*

Repeat from \* 1 more time.

#### End rounds:

Ch. of 5 ds, join to p on opposing ch, 8 ds, join to end p of 1<sup>st</sup> clover r, 4 ds, join to joining p of 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> rings, 6 ds, join to top p of 2<sup>nd</sup> r. Throw ch to create a small r of 4 ds, p, 4 ds, join to same spot, 6 ds, join to joining p of 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> rings, 4 ds, join to next p of 3<sup>rd</sup> clover, 8 ds, join to p of opposing chain, 5 ds, and join to next p, tie and cut.

Attach thread in the same manner on the other end of the bookmark and repeat end round directions. For clarity, refer to the diagram below. The end measurement of this bookmark is 5  $\frac{1}{4}$  " Have fun!!



Every chain around the claisies have 2 ds between p's.

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
